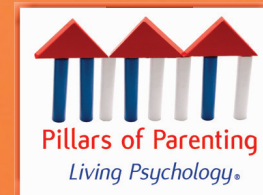

Why do so many 'looked after' children experience such poor life outcomes?

Governments, policy makers and researchers have been grappling with this question for decades, meanwhile an army of dedicated foster parents and residential childcare workers already know some of the answers but go unheard.

Local Authorities currently facing financial constraint are unable to consider the inevitable life long devastation caused by an unstable childhood in care, nor the long-term costs to society in terms of public health, mental health, crime, and prison.
