'Emotional Warmth Parenting'

A psychological, peer-reviewed research and an evidence-based approach, which empowers foster or adoptive parents and children's homes staff. Meaning that they know what to do, why to do it and how to check what is working well (or not), using the baseline as a reference point.



What you get:

1) Online Training: Learn what to do and why to do it.

Online training which shows how theory can inform practice. Each foster/ adoptive parent or children's home staff member can work at their own pace, gaining insight, aquiring a shared language, becoming trauma informed and learning about their strengths and strength-based practice.

The seven online modules

1. The impact of **Parental Rejection or Acceptance** and the importance of **Belonging**. This means that foster parents and childcare staff will have insights into each child's emotional pain, making them more empathetic, understanding and responsive.

2. Emotional Warmth Parenting with **Parenting Style** and **Close Relationships** (Attachment). Adults learn the parenting style principles informing their practice to help the child feel wanted and how this relationship is key to therapeutic change.

3. Growing the child's **Self-worth** and **Emotional Competence**. This means that the child's self-confidence is boosted and they can make and keep friends.

4. Building **Resilience** and **Personal and Social Responsibility**. Building a child's self-esteem makes them more resilient, and teaching personal and social responsibility is key to young people thriving in the community.


5. Becoming Trauma-Informed, **Adaptive Emotional Development** and recovery from trauma. This means parents and carers learn that behaviour may be linked to previous neglect or abuse and respond with compassion and sensitivity.


6. Understanding **Self-defeating Behaviour** and encouraging Self-management. Adults can identify triggers to challenging behaviour and the best way to respond.

7: Identifying your own and the young person's **Signature Strengths**. Both the adult and the child can find new meaning, motivation, enjoyment and the pleasure of succeeding.

2) Measurement and Results

Showing what's been achieved using the baseline record to highlight improvements (and parenting needs) by measuring the progress and development for each child on the eight Pillars of Parenting.





Recovery from trauma, our Adaptive Emotional Development

Also measured against the baseline are the Kate Cairns three stages of recovery from trauma, *Stabilisation, Integration and Adaptation*.

3) Our reader-friendly book

For each foster parent or member of the children's home staff.

What we provide for one year and the cost:


1) The seven modules online, e-learning training for each person.

2) Online assessment on each child's progress. Baseline and three further assessments for 10 or 20 children (depending on which option) for one year.

3) A copy of our book for each person.

or $\pounds 540$ +VAT monthly, for 20 people ($\pounds 27$ for each foster/adoptive parent or children's home staff member).

Measurement and Results:

Online assessment for adults in the parenting role to record a starting point (baseline) and evaluate the progress of a child from level 1, which indicates 'needs support' up to level 5 which means 'competent'. The assessment covers the eight Pillars of Parenting and the Cairns three phases of trauma. After the baseline, three assessments can be made annually.
